# Mark Your Calendar 

The monthly Calendar has been a centerpiece of the Mathematics Teacher for the last twenty-five years. The Editorial Panel of the Mathematics Teacher invites groups affiliated with mathematics education to sponsor a month of problems for the calendar.

Groups can include university teacher education programs (this is a wonderful opportunity for preservice teachers to be engaged in service to the professional community); NCTM affiliates; and high school or university math clubs. Groups may also team up to create a set of Calendar problems. When your Calendar appears, your efforts will be acknowledged.

Submissions by individuals of single problems or groups of problems are still encouraged and will be acknowledged in the solutions.

Please adhere to the following guidelines.

- Problems should cover a wide variety of difficulty levels. We recommend that $50 \%$ of the problems be accessible to all students; $35 \%$ of the problems be of moderate difficulty; and $15 \%$ of the problems be more challenging.
- Problems should be original.
- Nonroutine problems are particularly welcome.
- Submit at least 35 problems. Because of format constraints, it is possible that some problems may not be usable.
- See past Calendars for appropriate length of problems.
- Solutions must be submitted with all problems.
